He was a loving father and he was truly the ultimate #GIRLDAD. He couldn't escape it and later became a #GIRLGRANDDAD. Leonard loved his girls and they loved him back. It was nothing he would not do for them. He spent many hours at ballet class, recitals, basketball games, school trips, concerts, mall adventures and never once complained. Leonard had a special bond with each of his girls. Tracy and him shared a love for eating out. They would often have lunch dates and visit different restaurants around the city. Bria and him loved going to the movie theater together. They never missed a new release. Even as the girls grew up, he made sure to continue those special moments with his girls. He was always their

biggest cheerleader and supported whatever dreams and goals they had. He never missed a holiday or birthday celebration and even drove his oldest granddaughter's school to the farm just to get extra time with her. He enjoyed sports—ALL OF THEM—he would come to visit but you better have the game on because he did not want to miss a snap, shot, or pitch.
