Clara Reather Davis was born November 20, 1945, in Baltimore, Maryland to the late Benjamin and Emma Lee (Smith) Davis Sr. She peacefully transitioned from this life on February 8, 2023, at Future Care Courtland in Pikesville, Maryland.
