CLARENCE JACKSON was born to Carrie Lee and Caldwell Jackson, Jr. on May 19, 1926 in Allendale, SC. He was the youngest of three sons, Wilbur and Samuel being his older brothers.

Life was challenging in small town Allendale, forcing his father to join the military and his Mother to unfortunately, move elsewhere to find work, thus he was raised by his grandparents, Sarah and Hansford Berry. He learned so much from his grandfather about working hard, integrity and providing for his family.

Once reaching high school, he soon realized he too was faced with limited opportunities for growth in such a small town, so he joined the Air Force and before he knew it, he was on his way to the Philippines, Korea, Alaska and Vietnam to serve his country.
