James was called home after courageously battling several illnesses. Raised in Baltimore, Maryland, James accepted the Lord Jesus Christ as his personal Savior at a very early age. He became a member of Union Memorial United Methodist Church. As the years passed, desiring to grow in his faith and Christian walk, James decided to worship with the Catholic Church. James completed his early education in the Baltimore City Public School System. Graduating from Northwestern High School in 1972, he moved into higher education by enrolling into the Baltimore City Community College. James was accepted into the summer program at Harvard University where he majored in Biology. Once he completed the summer session at Harvard, he was accepted at Virginia Union University in Richmond, Virginia, where he continued to pursue his major in Biology. He received his Bachelor of Science degree in 1976. While at Virginia Union University, James joined the Gamma Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated in the Fall of 1975. James not only obtained a degree from Virginia Union University, but he also met and married his wife of 44 years, Pamela Charlene Fletcher on April 29, 1978, in Washington, DC. In 1985,

While attending middle and high school, he was employed by the Enoch Pratt Free Library. During his tenure at the FDA James received numerous citations and awards. He made numerous friends wherever he went and will be sincerely missed by everyone who knew him.
