Paula Tyler was a proud Baltimore native and graduate of Frederick Douglass High School, known early in life as a bold and determined student who stood firm in conviction and character.

After a dedicated career at Kopper Steel and Aluminum, Paula stepped away to provide care for her mother (Juanita Coleman-Tyler) and brother (Prann Tyler, Jr.)—an act that reflected her deep loyalty and commitment to family. Outside of business and church, Paula embraced life fully and enjoyed spending time with family and friends, cookouts, and eating crabs and jumbo shrimp—the bigger the crustacean... the better! Known to be strong-willed, persuasive, and unapologetically direct, Paula led with heart and made a

lasting impression wherever she went.
