



## William Allen Scott

March 1, 1938 - January 4, 2026

WILLIAM ALLEN SCOTT was born on March 1, 1938, in Ernul, North Carolina, the oldest of four children. His siblings and all others used the nickname "Scott" rather than his full name. Scott was baptized at an early age at Mary Martha Missionary Baptist Church, in Ernul, North Carolina.

He attended Vanceboro High School. His first job was working in a dry-cleaning establishment in New Bern, North Carolina. He married Millie Blount-Rice before moving his family to Baltimore, Maryland.

Scott drove cabs for a while once the family arrived in Baltimore. Always an ambitious hard worker, he began a lucrative career in sales which resulted in the ownership of his own business, Scott Enterprises. Scott was the first member of his family to own his own business. He started Scott and Sons Furniture at age 35.

Scott found much joy on the waterways. He enjoyed fishing and cruising on his yacht with the Neptune Yacht Club. As they cruised Baltimore Harbor to Annapolis, he enjoyed the camaraderie with fellow club members. After marrying Anne, they purchased a home in Woodlawn. He became a deacon at New Metropolitan Baptist Church where he served faithfully until his passing.

Scott had a big personality, He always spread joy and laughter, and he never met a stranger. He enjoyed dancing and spending time with his family, making the drive to North Carolina often. In his younger days, he had a “lead foot” and was notorious for outrunning law enforcement to avoid speeding tickets on these trips. He was a masterful and engaging storyteller as well and was loved by many. Scott was predeceased by his parents Emma Scott Guion and William Scott, wife Anne, sister Verna Scott Crump, and brother Calvin Guion.

Scott is survived by his children, Allen, Gerald, Yeshiyah (Angela), Lisa, Ronald and Earl; grandchildren, Tony, Richard, Ali, Aleah, Kenaya, Stephanie, Emmanuel, Jonathan, Marcy, Ahmed, Dora and Ryan; great-grandchildren, Keon, Kevin, LaDashia, and Richard, Jr.; sister, Classie Marie Minor; and many nieces, nephews, and cousins.
